The free exhibit, "Portraits of Nature," runs from Tuesday, Feb. 2 through Friday, March 26.

"Douglas Goodell is an outstanding photographer whose work inspires a sense of awe and wonder at the beauty of nature," said Robert Ceberio, the NJMC's executive director. "We are thrilled to have the opportunity to exhibit his work."
